

STATUS UPDATES

- Globally, Europe has 655339 cases, the Americas have 352592 and the global risk level is very high.
- Regionally, South Africa has the highest reported cases at 1,655 followed by Algeria at 1,251, Cameroon at 555, Burkina Faso 302, and Ivory Coast 245.

KENYA UPDATES

- Cases are mainly from Nairobi, Mombasa, Kilifi and Kwale - the Counties with historical high traffic movement to abroad.
- Movement control IN TO & OUT OF these counties for the period of 21 days effective 7.00pm April 6th (Nairobi) Kilifi, Mombasa, Kwale (7th April 7pm)
- New cases came from people who were placed under mandatory quarantine
- Government is currently testing all who are under mandatory quarantine
- Persons who pass away due to Coronavirus will have to be buried within 24 hours from the time of death.
- Visits to prisons in Kenya shall remain suspended for another 30 days.
- Government encourages wearing of masks in public spaces

GAPS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- Need for Personal Protective Equipment for staff and volunteers is still a critical need
- More Handwashing facilities are needed by more communities
- Heavy rains experienced in West Kenya and parts of central calls for a proper assessment and response to the MAM rains.
- Communities report loss of means of livelihood in some regions due to the curfew and increasing food prices, there could be need for relief support in the near future.
- Enhanced community engagement and awareness
- Need for more support of medical equipment to health facilities and response teams (ICU beds, ventilators, thermogun etc.)
